Professor Magloé was an inspirational professor who loved his students. He had a great sense of humor and a wonderful ability to treat each individual with respect and special consideration. He had a winning smile which could brighten a room. He loved sharing elements of the francophone world with students of French. It is in homage to this love and in gratitude for his service to the American Association of Teachers of French that the Yves Magloé Scholarship was created.
